an absorbing and moving autobiography an important addition not only to the literature of vietnam but to the larger human story of hope violence and disillusion in the political life of our era chicago tribune when he was a student in paris truong nhu tang met ho chi minh later he fought in the vietnamese jungle and emerged as one of the major figures in the fight for liberation and one of the most determined adversaries of the united states he became the vietcong s minister of justice but at the end of the war he fled the country in disillusionment and despair he now lives in exile in paris the highest level official to have defected from vietnam to the west this is his candid revealing and unforgettable autobiography

the autobiography of truong nhu tang who fought in the vietnamese jungle and emerged as one of the major n vietnamese figures in the fight for liberation

former vietcong official tells what vietnam thought it was fighting for what the reunified vietnam was like and why he left

in a gripping memoir that reads like a spy novel one man recounts his personal experience with operation phoenix the program created to destroy the vietcong s shadow government which thrived in the rural communities of south vietnam stuart a herrington was an american intelligence advisor assigned to root out the enemy in the hau nghia province his two year mission to capture or kill communist agents operating there was made all the more difficult by local officials who were reluctant to cooperate villagers who were too scared to talk and vc who would not go down without a fight herrington developed an unexpected but intense identification with the villagers in his jurisdiction and learned the hard way that experiencing war was profoundly different from philosophizing about it in a seminar room

story of a marine from boot camp to vietnam and home again

an account of the cia s organization in vietnam from 1968 to 1975

my detachment is a war story like none you have ever read before an unromanticized portrait of a young man coming of age in the controversial war that defined a generation in an astonishingly honest comic and moving account of his tour of duty in vietnam master storyteller tracy kidder writes for the first time about himself this extraordinary memoir is destined to become a classic kidder was an rote intelligence officer just months out of college and expecting a stateside assignment when his orders arrived for vietnam there lovesick anxious and melancholic he tried to assume command of his detachment a ragtag band of eight more or less ungovernable men charged with reporting on enemy radio locations he eventually learned not only to lead them but to laugh and drink with them as they shared the boredom pointlessness and fear of war together they sought a

ghostly enemy homing in on radio transmissions and funneling intelligence gathered by others kidder realized that he would spend his time in vietnam listening in on battle but never actually experiencing it with remarkable clarity and with great detachment kidder looks back at himself from across three and a half decades confessing how as a young lieutenant he sought to borrow from the tragedy around him and to imagine himself a romantic hero unrelentingly honest rueful and revealing my detachment gives us war without heroism while preserving those rare moments of redeeming grace in the midst of lunacy and danger the officers and men of my detachment are not the sort of people who appear in war movies they are the ones who appear only in war and they are unforgettable

here is a wealth of gossip level detail about life on the inside at the top in hanoi material hanoi watchers lust after seldom find indochina chronology a rarity a true north vietnamese insider speaking candidly book world 30 april 2000

now in its seventh printing the memoir of a woman whose strength courage and intelligence had a profound impact on vietnamese history not simply a participant in the viet minh resistance against the french mrs nguyen thi dinh was also an active leader who organized the uprising in ben tre province against the diem regime was appointed to the leadership committee of the national liberation front nlf and seved as chairman of the south vietnam women s liberation association the oppressive policies of diem and the problems of civil war and american involvement are described with powerful immediacy effectively illustrating the patriotic fervor and determination of those she fought with and helped lead

saigon fell to the viet cong on april 30 1975 kien nguyen watched the last u s army helicopter leave without him without his brother without his mother without his grandparents left to a nightmarish existence in a violated and decimated country kien was more at risk than most because of his odd blond hair and his light eyes because he was amerasian he was the most unwanted told with stark and poetic brilliance this is a story of survival and hope a moving and personal record of a tumultuous and important piece of history

one of the ten best books of the year washington post book world one of the los angeles times favorite books of the year one of the top ten national books of 2008 portland oregonian a 2009 honor book of the asian pacific american librarians association few books have combined the historical scope and the literary skill to give the foreign reader a sense of events from a vietnamese perspective now we can add andrew pham s eaves of heaven to this list of indispensable books new york times book review searing vivid and harrowing here is war and life through the eyes of a vietnamese everyman seattle times once wealthy landowners thong van pham s family was shattered by the tumultuous events of the twentieth century the french occupation of indochina the japanese invasion during world war ii and the vietnam war told in dazzling chapters that alternate between events in the past and those closer to the present the eaves of heaven brilliantly re creates the trials of everyday life in vietnam as endured by one man from the fall of hanoi and the collapse of french colonialism to the frenzied evacuation of saigon pham offers a rare portal into a lost world as he chronicles thong van pham s heartbreaks triumphs and bizarre reversals of fortune whether as a south vietnamese soldier pinned down by enemy \Box re a prisoner of the north vietnamese under brutal interrogation or a refugee desperately trying to escape vietnam after the last american helicopter has abandoned saigon this is the story of a man caught in the maelstrom of twentieth century politics a gripping memoir told with the urgency of a wartime dispatch by a writer of surpassing talent

a stunning psychological thriller about friship drugs and murder from the author of the vanishing egon wagter and axel van de graaf met when they were both fourteen and on vacation in belgium axel is fascinating filled with an amoral energy by which the more prudent less adventurous egon is both mesmerized and repelled even as a teen axel has a strange power over those around him he defies authority seduces women breaks the law axel chooses egon as a friend a friendship that somehow ures over time and ends up determining egon s fate during his university studies egon frequents axel s house in amsterdam where there is a party every night and women fill the rooms though egon chooses geology over axel s life of avarice and drug dealing he remains intrigued by his friend s conviction that the only law that counts is the law he makes himself egon believes that axel is a demonic figure who tempts others only because he knows they want to be tempted by the time he is in his forties egon finds himself divorced and with few professional prospects he turns for help to axel who sends him to ratanakiri a fictional country in southeast asia axel gives egon a suitcase to deliver and egon never returns utterly compelling and resonant the cave is an unforgettable story of betrayal in the spirit of tim krabbé s remarkable first novel the vanishing this memoir tells the story of a marine rifle platoon commander s time in the mountainous jungle of the northernmost province of the then republic of vietnam while tasked with fighting the enemy g m davis made some great friends but saw too much death the author tracks his tour of duty in the jungle leading marines not against the viet cong but against the north vietnamese army a well trained and well supplied professional army dedicated to unifying the two vietnams the heat the worry the responsibility and the daily grind took a toll amid firefights battles victory and loss contact with the enemy was frequent and the chaos of even a small fight was daunting davis also examines the political reality of the time arguing that the war was lost before it began but that the nation kept fighting and losing soldiers so politicians could look strong and keep their jobs looking back at the war he concludes it was a waste of lives and treasure

in the early hours of january 31 1968 eighty thousand north vietnamese and vietcong combat troops attacked every major city and military base in south vietnam the perimeter of the massive saigon airbase tan son nhut was breached and fighting raged all morning both gritty and intimate from chicago to vietnam tells the powerful story of the ensuing epic battle the tet offensive from the perspective of one brave american soldier michael duffy whose life like so many others would forever be changed duffy s war experience begins when he exits a c 130 cargo plane onto the tan son nhut tarmac a chaotic scene of blasts explosions and small arms fire sprinting to a waiting helicopter he is lifted up and over the city where he gets a bird s eye view of saigon under attack the helicopter lands on a road outside bien hoa base camp and duffy crawls in under enemy fire tumbling into a fox hole under cover of two gis later he meets up with his younger brother danny duffy in an ammunition convoy driving up highway 1 to the village of xuan loc after his brutal one year tour in vietnam duffy returns to chicago where he enjoys a christmas dinner with his family before enrolling as a freshman at colorado college like many vets his return from the war would be met with curiosity indifference and at times scorn this

harrowing memoir was thirty years in the making

like other kids in the bedford stuyvesant neighborhood of brooklyn ejovi nuwere grew up among thugs and drug dealers when he was eleven he helped form a gang at twelve he attempted suicide in his large extended family one uncle was a career criminal one a graduate student with his own computer by the time ejovi was fourteen he was spending as much time on the computer as his uncle was within a year he was well on his way to a hacking career that would lead him to one of the most audacious and potentially dangerous computer break ins of all time secret until now before he finished high school he had created a hidden life in the hacker underground and an increasingly prominent career as a computer security consultant at the age of twenty two he was a top security specialist for one of the world's largest financial houses hacker cracker is at once the most candid revelation to date of the dark secrets of cyberspace and the simple unaffected story of an inner city child's triumph over shattering odds to achieve unparalleled success

get out run we must leave this place they are going to destroy this whole place go children run first go now these were the final shouts nine year old kim pluc heard before her world dissolved into flames before napalm bombs fell from the sky burning away her clothing and searing deep into her skin it s a moment forever captured an iconic image that has come to define the horror and violence of the vietnam war kim was left for dead in a morgue no one expected her to survive the attack napalm meant fire and fire meant death against all odds kim lived but her journey toward healing was only beginning when the napalm bombs dropped everything kim knew and relied on exploded along with them her home her country s freedom her childhood innocence and happiness the coming years would be marked by excruciating treatments for her burns and unrelenting physical pain throughout her body which were constant reminders of that terrible day kim survived the pain of her body ablaze but how could she possibly survive the pain of her devastated soul fire road is the true story of how she found the answer in a god who suffered himself a savior who truly understood and cared about the depths of her pain fire road is a story of horror and hope a harrowing tale of a life changed in an instant and the power and resilience that can only be found in the power of god s mercy and love

lurps is the revised edition of the memoir of a juvenile delinquent who drops out of ninth grade to chase his dream of military service after volunteering for vietnam he joins the elite u s army lrrp rangers small heavily armed long range reconnaissance teams that patrol deep in enemy held territory it is 1968 and the lurps find themselves in some of the war s hairiest campaigns and battles including tet khe sanh and a shau readers witness all the horrors humor adrenaline and unexpected beauty through the eyes of a green young warrior gone are the heroic clichzs and bravado as compelling narrative and realistic dialogue sweep the reader along with a powerful sense that this is actually happening this poignant coming of age story explores the social background that shaped the protagonist s thinking his uncertain quest for redemption through increased responsibility the brotherhood of comrades in arms women and sexual awakening and the baffling randomness of who lives and who dies

company jimmy cross henry dobbins rat kiley mitchell sanders norman bowker kiowa and the character tim o brien who has survived his tour in vietnam to become a father and writer at the age of forty three taught everywhere from high school classrooms to graduate seminars in creative writing it has become required reading for any american and continues to challenge readers in their perceptions of fact and fiction war and peace courage and fear and longing the things they carried won france s prestigious prix du meilleur livre etranger and the chicago tribune heartland prize it was also a finalist for the pulitzer prize and the national book critics circle award

particular the young friends who inspired him to write this informative and rollicking memoir to ponder what would you do could you summon the bravery or the internal resistance to simply refuse to be part of the whole idiotic theater of the war or would you be like me

few americans have spent more time near the center of power than donald rumsfeld whose widely commented on memoir offers many previously undisclosed details about his service with four u s presidents we follow his rise from a middle class childhood to the navy to a seat in the u s congress at age thirty and his experiences there during the vietnam war and the civil rights era we also get his unique perspective as a cabinet level member of the nixon and ford administrations as ceo of two fortune 500 companies and as a special envoy to the middle east for president reagan rumsfeld also addresses the challenges and controversies of his time as secretary of defense during the 9 11 attacks by al qaida and the wars in afghanistan and iraq he includes candid observations on the differences of views within the pentagon and with other members of president george w bush s national security council in a famous press briefing rumsfeld once said that there are also unknown unknowns things we do not know we don t know his book makes us realize just how much we didn t know

drafted into the army in 1968 gillam transformed from an uncertain sergeant to an aggressive soldier serving in vietnam and cambodia as a regular point man and occasional tunnel rat who fought below ground the killing became close range and brutal gillam left the army in 1970 and he was once again a college student and destined to become a university professor

winner of the kiriyama pacific rim book prize a new york times notable book of the year winner of the whiting writers award a seattle post intelligencer best book of the year catfish and mandala is the story of an american odyssey a solo bicycle voyage around the pacific rim to vietnam made by a young vietnamese american man in pursuit of both his adopted homeland and his forsaken fatherland andrew x pham was born in vietnam and raised in california his father had been a pow of the vietcong his family came to america as boat people following the suicide of his sister pham quit his job sold all of his possessions and embarked on a year long bicycle journey that took him through the mexican desert around a thousand mile loop from narita to kyoto in japan and after five months and 2 357 miles to saigon where he finds nothing familiar in the bombed out darkness in vietnam he s taken for japanese or korean by his countrymen except of course by his relatives who doubt that as a vietnamese he has the stamina to complete his journey only westerners can do it and in the united states he s considered anything but american a vibrant picaresque memoir written with narrative flair and an eye opening sense of adventure catfish and mandala is an unforgettable search for cultural identity

a superb new graphic memoir in which an inspired artist storyteller reveals the road that brought his family to where they are today vietnamerica gb tran is a young vietnamese american artist who grew up distant from and largely indifferent to his family s history born and raised in south carolina as a son of immigrants he knew that his parents had fled vietnam during the fall of saigon but even as they struggled to adapt to life in america they preferred to forget the past and to focus on their children s future it was only in his late twenties that gb began to learn their extraordinary story when his last surviving grandparents die within months of each other gb visits vietnam for the first time and begins to learn the tragic history of his family and of the homeland they left behind in this family saga played out in the shadow of history gb uncovers the root of his father s remoteness and why his mother had remained in an often fractious marriage why his grandfather had abandoned his own family to fight for the viet cong why his grandmother had had an affair with a french soldier gb learns that his parents had taken harrowing flight from saigon during the final hours of the war not because they thought america was better but because they were afraid of what would happen if they stayed they entered america a foreign land they couldn t even imagine where family connections dissolved and shared history was lost within a span of a single generation in telling his family s story gb finds his own place in this saga of hardship and heroism vietnamerica is a visually stunning portrait of survival escape and reinvention and of the gift of the american immigrants dream passed on to their children vietnamerica is an unforgettable story of family revelation and reconnection and a new graphic memoir classic

sam adams loved intelligence work and that enthusiasm shines throughout this memoir of his years with the central intelligence agency his career was dominated by an epic struggle over vietnam over military attempts to hide the true size of the enemy forces there and over the integrity of the intelligence process adams s insistence on telling the truth caused an ungodly ruckus in both washington and saigon at the time and years later after the cia had threatened to fire him on thirteen occasions and he had quit the agency in disgust adams brought his story back up to the surface more loudly than ever in a cbs television documentary which eventually resulted in a notorious trial on libel charges brought by general william westmoreland after leaving the cia adams sat down to write an account of his life at the agency there is nothing else quite like the story he tells from the trade paperback edition

in 1982 john newman curator of the vietnam war literature collection at colorado state university said of w d ehrhart as a poet and editor bill ehrhart is clearly one of the major figures in vietnam war literature this autobiographical account of the war the author s first extended prose work demonstrates ehrhart s abilities as a writer of prose as well vietnam perkasie is grim comical disturbing and accurate the presentation is novelistic truly a page turner but the events are all real the atmosphere intensely evocative

in 1975 during the fall of saigon phuc tran immigrates to america along with his family by sheer chance they land in carlisle pennsylvania a small town where the trans struggle to assimilate into their new life in this coming of age memoir told through the themes of great books such as the metamorphosis the scarlet letter the iliad and more tran navigates the push and pull of finding and accepting himself despite the challenges of immigration feelings of isolation and teenage rebellion all while attempting to meet the rigid expectations set by his immigrant parents

black prisoner of war chronicles the story of james daly a young black soldier held captive for more than five years by the viet cong and north vietnamese and subsequently accused and acquitted of collaboration with the enemy one of the very few books about the vietnam war by an african american daly s memoir is both a testament to survival and a provocative meditation on the struggle between patriotism and religious conviction first published in 1975 as a hero s welcome daly s memoir had only a brief exposure before it sank from sight at the time most americans simply wanted to forget about the war but as jeff loeb argues daly s story is a compelling one that merits a much wider readership raised in brooklyn s bedford stuyvesant area daly fought to overcome difficult circumstances through hard work and religion when the vietnam war intervened he was denied conscientious objector status despite his strong pacifist beliefs he then enlisted in the u s army but only after a black recruiter assured him he would receive a non combat assignment instead he was sent to fight in vietnam where he was denied repeated requests for reassignment in protest he refused to load or fire his weapon even when sent out on patrol when his unit was ambushed by the viet cong he began his long ordeal in captivity first in the jungles of south vietnam and then in the infamous hanoi hilton as a pow he was still an outcast a black

grunt and pacifist among mostly white air force officers who considered any sort of accommodation treasonable such charges were eventually leveled at daly for joining the so called peace committee and signing a letter condemning american actions in the war although daly s decisions were in keeping with his pacifism and he was later cleared of the charges he remains a controversial figure for many vietnam veterans exploring the limits of both accommodation and resistance daly s memoir forces us to reassess the pow experience and race relations in vietnam as well as the complex relationship between personal belief and public duty

through the valley is the captivating memoir of the last u s army soldier taken prisoner during the vietnam war a narrative of courage hope and survival through the valley is more than just a war story it also portrays the thrill and horror of combat the fear and anxiety of captivity and the stories of friendships forged and friends lost in 1971 william reeder was a senior captain on his second tour in vietnam he had flown armed fixed wing ov 1 mohawks on secret missions deep into enemy territory in laos cambodia and north vietnam on his first tour he returned as a helicopter pilot eager to experience a whole new perspective as a cobra gunship pilot believing that nixon s vietnamization would soon end the war reeder was anxious to see combat action to him it appeared that the americans had prevailed beaten the viet cong and were passing everything over to the south vietnamese army so that americans could leave less than a year later while providing support to forces at the besieged base of ben het reeder s chopper went down in a flaming corkscrew though reeder survived the crash he was captured after evading the enemy for three days he was held for weeks in jungle cages before enduring a grueling forced march on the ho chi minh trail costing the lives of seven of his group of twenty seven pows imprisoned in the notorious prisons of hanoi reeder s tenacity in the face of unimaginable hardship is not only a captivating story but serves as an inspiration to all in through the valley william reeder shares the torment and pain of his ordeal but does so in the light of the hope that he

never lost his memoir reinforces the themes of courage and sacrifice undying faith strength of family love of country loyalty among comrades and a realization of how precious is the freedom all too often taken for granted sure to resonate with those serving in the armed forces who continue to face the demands of combat through the valley will also appeal especially to readers looking for a powerful riveting story
