a novel based on the life of the author's great grandmother follows the story of Vvry the child of a white plantation owner and one of his slaves through the years of the civil war and reconstruction

representing an international gathering of scholars fields watered with blood constitutes the first critical assessment of the full scope of Margaret Walker's literary career as they discuss Walker's work including the landmark poetry collection *For My People* and the novel *Jubilee* the contributors reveal the complex interplay of concerns and themes in Walker's writing folklore and prophecy place and space history and politics gender and race in addition the contributors remark on how Walker's emphases on spirituality and on dignity in her daily life make themselves felt in her writings and show how Walker's accomplishments as a scholar teacher activist mother and family elder influenced what and how she wrote a brief biography an interview with literary critic Claudia Tate a chronology of major events in Walker's life and a selected bibliography round out this collection which will do much to further our understanding of the writer whom poet Nikki Giovanni once called the most famous person nobody knows

a collection of short stories showcases the author's original works of magic realism fantasy horror and science fiction

in selecting Margaret Walker as the recipient of the Yale Series of Younger Poets in 1942 making her the first African American to receive this national literary award Stephen Vincent Benét proclaimed hers a vibrant new voice finding in her collection *For My People* a controlled intensity of emotion and a language that at times even when it is most modern has something of a surge of biblical poetry today more than seventy years later Walker's voice still resonates with particular power addressing the literature and culture of Black America this is my century first published in 1989 marked a significant contribution to American poetry bringing together Walker's selection of one hundred of her own poems on the eve of the centennial of Walker's birth the University of Georgia Press is proud to reissue this classic of American letters in addition to her award winning debut collection the volume includes *Prophets for a New Day* 1970 a celebration of the civil rights movement *October Journey* 1973 a collection of autobiographical and dedicatory poems and thirty seven previously uncollected poems

winner of the 2020 eudora welty prize theorists emphasize the necessity of writing about or witnessing trauma in order to overcome it to this critical conversation reading testimony witnessing trauma confronting race gender and violence in american literature treats reader response to traumatic and testimonial literature written by and about african american women and adds insight into the engagement of testimonial literature eden wales freedman articulates a theory of reading or dual witnessing that explores how narrators and readers can witness trauma together she places these original theories of traumatic reception in conversation with the african american literary tradition to speak to the histories cultures and traumas of african americans particularly the repercussions of slavery as witnessed in african american literature the volume also considers intersections of race and gender and how narrators and readers can cross such constructs to witness collectively reading testimony witnessing trauma s innovative examinations of raced gendered intersections open and speak with those works that promote dual witnessing through the fraught literary histories of race and gender relations in america to explicate how dual witnessing converses with american literature race theory and gender criticism the book analyzes emancipatory narratives by sojourner truth harriet jacobson and elizabeth keckley and novels by william faulkner zora neale hurston margaret walker toni morrison and jesmyn ward

neoslave narratives is a study in the political social and cultural content of a given literary form the novel of slavery cast as a first person slave narrative after discerning the social and historical factors surrounding the first appearance of that literary form in the 1960s neoslave narratives explores the complex relationship between nostalgia and critique while asking how african american intellectuals at different points between 1976 and 1990 remember and use the site of slavery to represent the crucial cultural debates that arose during the sixties

the neo slave narrative is an important development in american literary history and has serious revisionist intentions at its foundation this book examines how contemporary african american women writers have shaped the genre these authors have written neo slave narratives to reinscribe history from the perspective of the african american woman most specifically the nineteenth century enslaved mother the writers considered in this study sherley anne williams toni morrison j california cooper gayl jones and octavia butler explore american slavery through the lens of gender both to interrogate the myth that enslaved women denied the privilege of having a gender identity by the institution of slavery were in fact genderless and to celebrate the acts of resistance which enabled enslaved women to mother in the fullest sense of the term the volume begins with an overview of historical representations of slavery in america from the slave narrative itself to the revisionist scholarship of the 1960s the book then examines several individual neo slave narratives such as margaret walker s jubilee 1966 williams dessa rose 1986 morrison s beloved 1987 cooper s family 1991 jones corregidora 1975 and butler s kindred 1979 what the women in these novels have in common is the fact that they mother what the writers have in common is a tendency to utilize subversive strategies such as reversal blurring and the creation of myth to dramatize gender identity and to highlight the varied nature of motherhood as enslaved women experienced it the final chapter evaluates the influence of the neo slave narrative on american literature in general and on popular perceptions and misperceptions of african american women
