giorgio vasari and the birth of the museum offers the first dedicated and comprehensive study of vasari s original contributions to the making of museums addressing the subject from the full range of aspects collecting installation conceptual historical in which his influence is strongly felt uniting specialists of giorgio vasari with scholars of historical museology this collection of essays presents a cross disciplinary overview of vasari s approaches to the collecting and display of art artifacts and memorabilia although the main focus of the book is on the mid late 16th century contributors also bring to light that vasari s museology enjoyed a substantial afterlife well into the modern museum era this volume is a fundamental addition to the museum studies literature and a welcome enhancement to the scholarly industry on giorgio vasari

in the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries the first modern public museums of art civic state or national appeared throughout europe setting a standard for the nature of such institutions that has made its influence felt to the present day although the emergence of these museums was an international

development their shared history has not been systematically explored until now taking up that project this volume includes chapters on fifteen of the earliest and still major examples from the capitoline museum in rome opened in 1734 to the alte pinakothek in munich opened in 1836 these essays consider a number of issues such as the nature display and growth of the museums collections and the role of the institutions in educating the public the introductory chapters by art historian carole paul the volume s editor lay out the relationship among the various museums and discuss their evolution from private noble and royal collections to public institutions in concert the accounts of the individual museums give a comprehensive overview providing a basis for understanding how the collective emergence of public art museums is indicative of the cultural social and political shifts that mark the transformation from the early modern to the modern world the fourteen distinguished contributors to the book include robert g w anderson former director of the british museum in london paula findlen ubaldo pierotti professor of italian history at stanford university thomas gaehtgens director of the getty research institute and andrew mccllellan dean of academic affairs and professor of art history at tufts university show more show less

fifty full color and 350 black and white photographs illustrate the birth project exhibit conceived by judy chicago based on nearly one hundred of her works and needleworked by women across the country between 1980 1985 judy chicago designed dozens of images on the subject of birth and creation to be embellished by needleworkers around the united states canada and as far away as new zealand formatted into provocative exhibition units which included both needleworks and documentary materials these works toured the country and canada eventually placed by through the flower in numerous institutions where they are on public view or used as part of university curricula prior to the birth project few images of birth existed in western art a puzzling omission as birth is a central focus of many women's lives and a universal experience of all humanity as everyone is born seeking to fill this void judy chicago created multiple images of birth to be realized through needlework a visually rich medium which has been ignored or trivialized by the mainstream art community

few perspectives have invigorated the development of critical museum studies over the late twentieth and early twenty first centuries as much as foucault's account of the relations between knowledge and power and their role in processes of governing within this literature tony bennett's work stands out as having marked a series of strategic engagements with foucault's work to offer a critical genealogy of the public museum offering an account of its nineteenth century and early twentieth century development that has been constantly alert to the politics of museums in the present museums power knowledge brings together new research with a set of essays initially published in diverse contexts making available for the first time the full range of bennett's critical museology ranging across natural history anthropological art geological and history museums and their precursors in earlier collecting institutions and spanning the eighteenth to the twenty first centuries in discussing museum practices in britain australia the usa france and japan it offers a compelling account of the shifting political logics of museums over the modern period as a collection that aims to bring together the signature work of a museum theorist and historian whose work has long occupied a distinctive place in museum society debates museums

this handsomely illustrated volume traces the intersections of art history and paintings restoration in nineteenth century europe repairing works of art and writing about them the practices that became art conservation and art history share a common ancestry by the nineteenth century the two fields had become inseparably linked while the art historical scholarship of this period has been widely studied its restoration practices have received less scrutiny until now this book charts the intersections between art history and conservation in the treatment of italian renaissance paintings in nineteenth century europe initial chapters discuss the restoration of works by giotto and titian framed by the contemporary scholarship of art historians such as jacob burckhardt g b cavalcaselle and joseph crowe that was redefining the earlier age subsequent chapters recount how paintings conservation was integrated into museum settings the narrative uses period texts unpublished archival materials and historical photographs in probing how paintings looked at a time when scholars were writing the foundational texts of art history and how contemporary restorers were negotiating the appearances of these works the book proposes a model for a new conservation history object focused yet enriched by consideration of a wider cultural horizon

gian lorenzo bernini was the greatest sculptor of the baroque period and yet surprisingly there has never before been a major exhibition of his sculpture in north america bernini and the birth of baroque portrait sculpture showcases portrait sculptures from all phases of the artist s long career from the very early antonio coppola of 1612 to clement x of about 1676 one of his last completed works bernini s portrait busts were masterpieces of technical virtuosity at the same time they revealed a new interest in psychological depth bernini s ability to capture the essential character of his subjects was unmatched and had a profound influence on other leading sculptors of his day such as alessandro algardi giuliano finelli and francesco mochi bernini and the birth of baroque portrait sculpture is a groundbreaking study that features drawings and paintings by bernini and his contemporaries together they demonstrate not only the range skill and acuity of these masters of baroque portraiture but also the interrelationship of the arts in seventeenth century rome

barkley l hendricks birth of the cool accompanies the first career retrospective of the renowned american artist barkley l hendricks on view at the nasher museum of art at duke university from february 7 2008 through july 13 2008 hendricks was born in 1945 in philadelphia his unique work contains elements of both american realism and postmodernism occupying a space between the portraitists chuck close and alex katz and the pioneering black conceptualists david hammons and adrian piper hendricks is best known for his life sized portraits of people of color from the urban northeast his bold portrayal of his subject s attitude and style elevates the common person to celebrity status cool empowering and sometimes confrontational hendricks artistic privileging of a culturally complex black body has paved the way for today s younger generation of artists this richly illustrated book contains 100 color images of paintings created from 1964 to the present it focuses primarily on the artist s full figure portraits as well as lesser known early works and the artist s more recent portal like landscape paintings the catalog includes the most comprehensive bibliography on hendricks to date a timeline of the artist s life and an interview with the artist by thelma golden director and chief curator at the studio museum in harlem it also includes essays by barkley l hendricks duke university art historian richard j powell exhibition curator trevor schoonmaker and franklin sirmans curator of modern and contemporary art at the menil collection

the scandalous story of america s first supermodel sex goddess and modern celebrity evelyn nesbit by the time of her sixteenth birthday in 1900 evelyn nesbit was known to millions as the most photographed woman of her era an iconic figure who set the standard for female beauty and whose innocent sexuality was used to sell everything from chocolates to perfume women wanted to be her men just wanted her but when evelyn s life of fantasy became all too real and her insanely jealous millionaire husband harry k thaw murdered her lover new york city architect stanford white the most famous woman in the world became infamous as she found herself at the center of the crime of the century and a scandal that signaled the beginning of a national obsession with youth beauty celebrity and sex

in response to unprecedented environmental degradation activists and popular movements have risen up to fight the crisis of climate change and the ongoing devastation of the earth the environmental movement has undeniably influenced even its adversaries as the language of sustainability can be found in corporate mission statements government policy and national security agendas however the price of success has been compromise prompting soul searching and questioning of the politics of environmentalism is it a revolutionary movement that opposes the current system or is it reformist changing the system by working within it in birth of a new earth adrian parr argues that this is a false choice calling for a shift from an opposition between revolution and incremental change to a renewed collective imagination parr insists that environmental destruction is at its core a problem of democratization and decolonization it requires reckoning with militarism market fundamentalism and global inequality and mobilizing an alternative political vision capable of freeing the collective imagination in order to replace an apocalyptic mindset frozen by the spectacle of violence birth of a new earth locates the emancipatory work of environmental politics in solidarities that can bring together different constituencies fusing opposing political strategies and paradigms by working both inside and outside the prevailing system she discusses experiments in food sovereignty collaborative natural resource management and public interest design initiatives that test new models of economic democratization ultimately parr proclaims environmental politics is the refusal to surrender life to the violence of global capitalism corporate governance and militarism this defiance can serve as the source for the birth of a new earth

in this entertaining and informative book walter friedman chronicles the remarkable metamorphosis of the american salesman from itinerant amateur to trained expert from the mid nineteenth century to the eve of world war ii the development of sales management transformed an economy populated by peddlers and canvassers to one driven by professional salesmen and executives from book agents flogging ulysses s grant s memoirs to john h patterson s famous pyramid strategy at national cash register to the determined efforts by ford and chevrolet to craft surefire sales pitches for their dealers selling evolved from an art to a science salesmanship as a term and a concept arose around the turn of the century paralleling the new science of mass production managers assembled professional forces of neat responsible salesmen who were presented as hardworking pillars of society no longer the butt of endless traveling salesman jokes people became prospects their homes became territories as an ncr representative said the modern salesman let the light of reason into dark places

the study of selling itself became an industry producing academic disciplines devoted to marketing consumer behavior and industrial psychology at carnegie mellon s bureau of salesmanship research walter dill scott studied the characteristics of successful salesmen and ways to motivate consumers to buy full of engaging portraits and illuminating insights birth of a salesman is a singular contribution that offers a clear understanding of the transformation of salesmanship in modern america reviews of this book the history friedman weaves is engrossing and the book hits stride with entertaining chapters on mark twain s marketing of the memoirs of ulysses s grant apparently twain was as talented a businessman as a writer and on the shift from the drummer the middleman between wholesalers and regional shopkeepers to the department store in birth of a salesman friedman has crafted a history of an inherently unlikable process with depth affection and intelligent analysis carlo wolff boston globe i very much enjoyed reading this book it is well written well argued and thoroughly researched salesmen friedman argues helped distribute the products of america s increasingly bountiful manufacturing industries invented new forms of managerial hierarchies investigated the psychology of desire and were in the vanguard of america s transformation from a producer to a consumer society he powerfully shows that the rise of modern business practices and the emergence of a particularly american culture of consumption can only be fully understood if we examine the history of selling sven beckert author of the monied metropolis walter friedman s birth of a salesman the transformation of selling in america is an important book the modern industrial economy created in the united states and europe between the 1880s and the 1930s required the integration of large scale production and marketing the evolution of mass production is a well known story but friedman is the first to fill in the crucial marketing side of that industrial revolution alfred d chandler jr author of the visible hand and scale and scope with wit and verve walter friedman gives us a cast of memorable characters who turned salesmanship from ballyhoo to behaviorism from silliness to science informed by prodigious research birth of a salesman also clarifies the birth of modern marketing from an angle that humanizes its subject through wry ironic but serious analysis this is a pioneering work on a subject crucial to american social cultural and business history thomas k mcclaw author of creating modern capitalism

the first illustrated monograph dedicated to the history of the house of worth the world s pioneering haute couture label arriving in paris in 1845 at the age of twenty and with only a few francs in his pocket charles frederick worth would go on to build the most prominent innovative and successful fashion house of the century he was inspired by a love of fine art luxurious fabrics and his vision of the female ideal and was the first to set out to dictate new styles and silhouettes to his elite clientele not the other way around he hosted them in his rue de la paix salons which included groundbreaking sportswear and maternity departments as well as silk velvet and brocade rooms and a special salon with closed shutters and gas lighting designed to allow clients to try on ball gowns in lighting conditions precisely matched to those of the event at which they would be worn organized chronologically and illustrated with striking ensembles paintings and documents sourced from both private family archives and the best fashion collections from museums around the world the house of worth is an inspiring tribute to the house that started it all

in 1979 edward p alexander s museums in motion was hailed as a much needed addition to the museum literature in combining the history of museums since the eighteenth century with a detailed examination of the function of museums and museum workers in modern society it served as an essential resource for those seeking to enter to the museum profession and for established professionals looking for an expanded understanding of their own discipline now mary alexander has produced a newly revised edition of the classic text bringing it the twenty first century with coverage of emerging trends resources and challenges new material also includes a discussion of the children s museum as a distinct type of institution and an exploration of the role computers play in both outreach and traditional in person visits
