income inequality is an increasingly pressing issue in the united states and around the world this book explores five critical issues to introduce some of the key moral and empirical questions about income gender and racial inequality do we have a moral obligation to eliminate poverty is inequality a necessary evil that s the best way available to motivate economic action and increase total output can we retain a meaningful democracy even when extreme inequality allows the rich to purchase political privilege is the recent stalling out of long term declines in gender inequality a historic reversal that presages a new gender order how are racial and ethnic inequalities likely to evolve as minority populations grow ever larger as intermarriage increases and as new forms of immigration unfold leading public intellectuals debate these questions in a no holds barred exploration of our new gilded age

america s remarkable explosion of industrial output and national wealth at the end of the nineteenth century was matched by a troubling rise in poverty and worker unrest as politicians and intellectuals fought over the causes of this crisis henry george 1839 1897 published a radical critique of laissez faire capitalism and its threat to the nation s republican traditions progress and poverty 1879 which became a surprise best seller offered a provocative solution for preserving these traditions while preventing the amassing of wealth in the hands of the few a single tax on land values george s writings and years of social activism almost won him the mayor s seat in new york city in 1886 though he lost the election his ideas proved instrumental to shaping a popular progressivism that remains essential to tackling inequality today edward t o donnell s

exploration of George's life and times merges labor, ethnic, intellectual, and political history to illuminate the early militant labor movement in New York during the Gilded Age. He locates in George's rise to prominence the beginning of a larger effort by American workers to regain control of the workplace and obtain economic security and opportunity. in the early twentieth century over two hundred of new york s most glamorous socialites joined the suffrage movement although they were dismissed by critics as bored socialites these gilded suffragists were at the epicenter of the great reforms known collectively as the progressive era from championing education for women to pursuing careers and advocating for the end of marriage these women were engaged with the swirl of change that swept through the streets of new york city
